

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT



The Decalogue is a choice of life that God proposes to man: "I set before you today life and death, that is, good and evil; I command you to keep the commandments that you may live" (cf. Deut 30:15 ff). The Decalogue is for man, not against him; it is not meant to bind or limit his freedom, but rather to liberate it. What it forbids, in fact, is not something capricious that displeases God we do not know why, but is what compromises man himself and his possibility first of all to have balanced relationships with others: to be, in other words, authentically man. Sabbath rest, for example, is useful to man so that he is not reduced to a beast of labour, any more than is required by God, and it is required by God precisely because it is good for man. The Decalogue is also 'secular' in the sense that it touches the everyday, profane situations of life: the family, social relations, work, sexual life. It truly fulfils that task of authenticating worship with life. This is how the word of God becomes an occasion for Lenten renewal today.

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Law was given through Moses. God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it. 'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy.

While the Jews demand miracles and the Greeks look for wisdom, here are we preaching a crucified Christ; to the Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans madness, but to those who have been called, whether they are Jews or Greeks, a Christ who is the power and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength. **The Word of the Lord.**

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

GOSPEL John 2:13-25

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said. During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him. **The Gospel of the Lord.**

For anyone who drinks it, says the Lord, the water I shall give will become in him a spring welling up to eternal life.

The liturgical vestment is violet.

Lenten Penance & Obligations

The Church's Canon Law reaffirms our obligation to do penance. The special times of penance are all Fridays throughout the year, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and the season of Lent.

Days of Penance

On all other Fridays of the year the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing and one of the following:

- A) Prayer— for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary.
- B) Self-denial—for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country (eg, Project Compassion).
- C) Helping others—for example, special attention to someone who is poor, physically or mentally ill, elderly, lonely, bereaved, addicted or overburdened.
