FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



In the 15th year of Tiberius Caesar's empire, on the banks of the river Jordan, at a precise point in time and space, that prophecy became a reality in Jesus of Nazareth, when the Spirit came upon him. Jesus is not like Moses who merely promulgates the covenant; he fulfils it perfectly. He fulfils it perfectly in his own person. In him, God and man no longer speak to each other at a distance; the two allies are one undivided person. For this reason, the covenant is not only new, but also eternal. Before dying, Jesus establishes a memorial of this new covenant that is the Eucharist: "This is the cup of my blood for the new and everlasting covenant, poured out for the remission of sins. No longer the blood of a lamb or a goat (Ex 24:8), but that of the Son. This is the glorification of the name of God that we heard in the Gospel passage: on the cross, sins are forgiven, man is reconciled with his Creator, God's sovereignty and holiness are recognised in the obedience of the Son of man; Christ "draws all things to himself" in order to hand them over to the Father. The Church is the place and the fruit of the covenant. In it, Christ's disciples live the wonderful experience of being fellow citizens of the

saints, friends and family members of God (Eph 2:19). Every Sunday, gathering around the table of Christ's word and bread, the community rehearses the profound story of its covenant with God, relives its milestones and fundamental gestures, up to the supreme gesture that we are now about to repeat with the consecration of the "cup of the new and everlasting covenant.

Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind. The Word of the Lord.
