

SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION YEAR B 31st March 2024

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON Luke 24:34; cf. Rv 1:6

The Lord is truly risen, alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia.

FIRST READING Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

(R.) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

- 1. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' (R.)

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 5:6-8

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

You must know how even a small amount of yeast is enough to leaven all the dough, so get rid of all the old yeast, and make yourselves into a completely new batch of bread, unleavened as you are meant to be. Christ, our passover, has been sacrificed; let us celebrate the feast, then, by getting rid of all the old yeast of evil and wickedness, having only the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

SEOUENCE

Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer sacrifice and praise. The sheep are ransomed by the Lamb; and Christ, the undefiled, hath sinners to his Father reconciled. Death with life contended: combat strangely ended!

Life's own Champion, slain, yet lives to reign. Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose! The angels there attesting; shroud with grave-clothes resting. Christ, my hope, has risen: he goes before you into Galilee. That Christ is truly risen from the dead we know. Victorious king, thy mercy show!

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION 1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Mark 16:1-7

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

When the sabbath was over, Mary of Magdala, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices with which to go and anoint him. And very early in the morning on the first day of the week they went to the tomb, just as the sun was rising. They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' But when they looked they could see that the stone – which was very big – had already been rolled back. On entering the tomb they saw a young man in a white robe seated on the right hand side, and they were struck with amazement. But he said to them, 'There is no need for alarm. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified: he has risen, he is not here. See, here is the place where they laid him. But you must go and tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going before you to Galilee; it is there you will see him, just as he told you." The Gospel of the Lord.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The angel who appeared to the women on Easter morning said to them: "Do not be afraid. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He is risen!" We can easily imagine what happened next. The women rushed down the hill, holding up their robes with their hands to run faster. Entering the cenacle, they all began to shout the Master, the "The Master, what?" "Rerisen, risen! The tomb, the tomb!" "The tomb, what?" "Empty, it is empty!" The news was too big to be contained by the poor women or to be told calmly, neatly. orderly. The apostles probably had to raise their voices and scold them to calm down and tell what had happened in an orderly manner. But even before the women opened their mouths, everyone, looking at them, had understood from their wide-open eyes that something unprecedented had happened. A chill had gone through their bodies; the sense of the supernatural had filled the room and each of those present. From that moment on, the world would never be the same again. The good news of Christ's resurrection thus began its journey through history, like a long, calm and majestic wave, which no one and nothing will be able to stop until the end of time. Everything, in fact, that exists and moves in the Church - sacraments, words, institutions - draws its strength from the resurrection of Christ. It is the moment in which death was transformed into life and history into eschatology. It is the new creation. The liturgy expresses this by choosing, as the first reading of the Easter Vigil, the Genesis account of creation. It is the new fiat lux! Let there be light!


