## SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER—DIVINE MERCY



In the New Testament, the word "Passover" does not refer to the resurrection, but only to the Paschal Supper or to the sacrifice of Jesus. In the II century began to say : "Passover is Christ", or: "The Paschal mystery is Christ" (St. Justin and Meliton of Sardes). And since in Christ death and resurrection were inseparable, the word "Passover" gradually, albeit with some resistance, came to be understood also as the resurrection of Christ Passover was an earlier custom, which Christians derived from the Old Testament. Its symbolism condemned sacrifice, blood, sacrifice. Christians therefore had no any problem with transferring this symbolism to the passion of Christ. The first use of the stowa in the Christian sig-meaning refers precisely to the offering of the Passover lamb: "Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed!" (1 Corinthians 5:7). In Greek culture, the similarity between the Hebrew word "Passover" and the Greek verb pasechin ("to suffer") made, That for a long time Passover was equated with the Passion. Overcoming these difficulties was made possible by St. Augustine, who discovered that St. John had reinterpreted the term "Passover," giving it the meaning of Christ's passing "from this world to the Father" (J 13, 1). "Through the Passion, the Lord passed from death to life, opening the way for us who believe in His resurrection. ascension, so that we too may pass from death to life". (Psalm 120). The Resurrection is so crucial to faith, that, as St. Paul says, without it our faith would be "empty" and without foundation (1 Corinthians 15:14). There we hear the word of Jesus, remember his death and resurrection; communing with him, we touch him as Thomas did. We give a breath of fresh air to our faith. Sunday Mass can be, and usually is, the gathering time par excellence in the village or neighbourhood, the time when people meet, greet each other in a festive atmosphere, in short, break the anonymity that so dehumanizes life today. St. Augustine writes: "The faith of Christians is the resurrection of Christ. Everyone, even pagans, believes that Christ died, but only Christians believe that he rose from the dead. Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness - since the Spirit is the truth. #### **GOSPEL** John 20:19-31

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name. **The Gospel of the Lord**.
